

Resolution to End Mail-Ballot Voting in County

WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence says government gets its power from the consent of the people, and the Tenth Amendment states that powers not given to the federal government belong to the states and the people, which supports letting local communities choose voting methods that protect trust and accuracy in elections;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the **County** supports removing mail ballots as a voting option and returning to in-person voting only, so that all votes are cast and counted with stronger local oversight and better election security.

Resolution in County to Support Local Control of Voter Registration

WHEREAS, America's founding ideas in the Declaration of Independence and the Tenth Amendment say that powers not given to the federal government belong to the states and the people, and our local County Clerks are closest to the community and best able to keep voter records accurate and up to date;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the County supports restoring full local authority to County Clerks to manage and update voter registration records so elections stay accurate, transparent, and trusted by the people.

Resolution in County Instructing County Clerks to Verify Before Making a Voter Active

WHEREAS, America’s founding ideas in the Declaration of Independence and the Tenth Amendment say that powers not given to the federal government belong to the states and the people, and because County Clerks know their communities best, they are the right officials to verify a voter’s citizenship, identity, and home address before making someone an active voter;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the County supports requiring County Clerks to verify each person’s citizenship, identity, and physical address before changing any voter to active status.

Resolution in County to maintain Local Control of Voter Status Changes

WHEREAS, America’s founding ideas in the Declaration of Independence and the Tenth Amendment say that powers not given to the federal government belong to the states and the people, and local County Clerks are the officials closest to the community who can best check a voter’s citizenship, identity, and home address before giving them active status;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the **County** supports requiring all voter records sent from state-level or outside systems to be marked Inactive until the local County Clerk verifies the voter’s citizenship, identity, and physical address, ensuring accuracy and trust in our elections.

Resolution in County for Local Oversight of Voter Record Updates

WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence says government gets its power from the consent of the people, and the Tenth Amendment states that powers not given to the federal government belong to the states and the people, which supports the right of local County Clerks—who know their community best—to verify address changes, deaths, and other voter-record updates before they are made;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the **County** supports giving the County Clerk full local authority to review and verify all voter registration updates so that county voter records stay accurate, lawful, and trustworthy.
